Hand in Hand Supporting Medical Care in Sudan

A lot of people in Khartum and all over Sudan nowadays have no adequate access to medical care. Indeed there are good quality hospitals for the minority of rich people, but most people cannot afford the high financial burden of private health care.

We want to provide a reasonable cost free medical care for these poorly supported people and do so together with our local partner in Khartum, the Imam Fachrudin Charity Organization.



Projects Planning

In detail we promote and support the following projects:

A medical center for basic health care of mostly internal diseases has already been at work for a few years, it is located at the Imam Ali Complex in Khartum.



Now this medical center is being expanded to a two story building with about 850 sqm, the following departments have already been established or are expected to start working soon:

- surgical ward
- obstetrics and gynecology
- pediatrics
- orthopedics
- ophthalmology
- dentistry

Nevertheless, a lot of medical equipment is still missing like sonography, x-ray and laboratory devices.

The main focus will be medical attendance to children, pregnant women and the elderly.

We are also planning to build a new hospital (Al Habib Health Center) in Khartum. This hospital would allow inpatient treatment for those severely ill who cannot be helped sufficiently by the outpatient possibilities of the existing medical center.

In some far-off regions of Sudan health care is a real challenge. The main causes are the insufficient infrastructur and often adverse climate conditions.

Already in recent years, teams of the medical center have been on their way to far-off regions to supply people with vaccinations and a basic medical care.

An upgrade of their gear and medical equipment is urgently needed, especially with regard to medicine, equipment for peritoneal dialysis and financial resources.
